

Transition Exercise: Medical Record Information



YIKES! My new doctor needs information from my medical record!!!

View your medical records online: MyChart is convenient and can help you access your medical records online from your computer, tablet or smartphone. Create or access your MyChart account by visiting <https://mychart.texaschildrens.org/MyChart/>.

If you are 18 years old you can request your medical record yourself.
If you are under 18, a parent will need to help you request your medical record.

First call Medical Records at Texas Children's Hospital at **832-824-1600**. They will get you the forms you need to allow your medical record to be sent to your new health care provider. Medical Records will either mail or fax the forms to you. Note, you might have to wait up to two weeks to get the forms in the mail. There may be a charge to get your medical records so ask if there is any cost. If you have the information sent directly to your new doctor, it may not cost you anything.
